



CYP Dynamic Support Register 0-18yrs – Information Sheet

What is The Dynamic Support Register?

The Dynamic Support Register or DSR is a Digital Register. When you agree to be included on the DSR, information is stored about you, for example;

- Your name
- Your date of birth
- Where you live and who with
- Who is working with you
- What support you have
- · How you are and if you are having any difficulties at the moment
- · A plan of how others can help you

It is your choice if you want your details to be on the DSR or not, you can change your mind and have your details removed from the DSR at any time.

Your information will be stored securely and is only available to the professionals supporting you.

Who is the Dynamic Support Register For?

- People with a Learning Disability and/or Autism
- People who are at risk of going to hospital due to; behaviour that others may find challenging and/or complex mental health difficulties.

Why do we need a Dynamic Support Register?

The DSR will support those around you to ensure;

- If you are finding things difficult, people will work with you to understand what is happening and to plan the best ways to help you
- · You are treated with the same dignity and respect as everybody else
- · You have a home within your community
- You can develop and maintain relationships with the people that are important to you
- You are supported to stay living in the community and out of hospital wherever this is possible

How does the Dynamic Support Register help me?

- It helps the people supporting you to work together.
- It helps people working with you to give the support you need when you need it.
- It helps you to stay in community and out of hospital wherever this is possible.





What happens if I need to go to hospital?

Sometimes if people are unwell they might need to go to hospital to get the help they need to feel better.

The DSR will help people who are working with you to make a plan to help you to move back to the community as soon as possible with the right support.

What happens if I am not on the Dynamic Support Register?

People working with you will still give you support if you need it but being included on the DSR means that more services will know about your needs.

If more services are aware of your needs they may be able to make a support plan more quickly in an emergency.
