Complementary Therapy

Commissioning decision	Funding approval must be sought from the ICB via the Individual Funding Request process prior to treatment.

Complementary and Alternative Medicine is a title used to refer to a diverse group of health-related therapies and disciplines which are not considered to be a part of mainstream medical care. The therapies provided by complementary and alternative medicine practitioners may be provided alongside conventional medicine or may be viewed by their practitioners as a substitute for it.

The ICB will only fund interventions that are supported by evidence that demonstrates clinical and cost effectiveness. At this time there is insufficient high quality evidence to demonstrate the clinical and cost effectiveness of complementary and alternative medicine. Complementary and alternative medicines are therefore considered a low priority and will not be normally funded. The policy statement will be reviewed in the light of new evidence as appropriate.

Patients who are not eligible for treatment under this policy can be considered on an individual basis where GP or clinician believes there are exceptional clinical circumstances to policy.
